Lessons Learned

Parents in PTOC grant were twice as likely to have a Parenting Time Order.

Non-Custodial Parents paid about the same percent of child support due regardless of PTO




Closer look at Non Custodial Parents

- 57 families (out of 140 scheduled) returned to Court for 90 day follow-up
- 85% reported being highly engaged (once a week or more visits)
- 95% reported being satisfied with their relationship with their children
- 50% reported being satisfied with the quality of communication with the custodial parent
- 78% paid 50% or more of child support due (average=68%)
